### 2025 April Block of the Month

The upcoming month's block will be shown at the monthly meeting and instructions will be on the QUIP website.

BOM #3 will be turned in at the April meeting. Each month's block will be made with patterned fabrics in black, white and a feature color. The month's feature color will be the color from the previous month's fat quarter swap. So April's BOM will be made with yellow (March's color) as the featured color. Please see the attached sample of April's BOM and this month's block directions.





Another caravan had joined with the clan of the gypsy quilter and as the Newcomers brought out their silks and prettys from far-away lands, the Gypsy quilter and her friends joined in the bartering. They wrapped their Waists and shoulders with multi-colored scarves. In one cart was a chest Full of ribbons so varied, some had threads of gold and some were spun Of threads as fine as a spider's web. Before long they were trimmed In ribbons.

That evening as fires snapped sparks into the night air the young girls Danced with exotic fabrics swirling round them. The ribbons laced Through their hair, floated around their faces flirting past dark eyes. Whether it was from the sparks or the excitement in Sofia's eyes, Josef, Usually so shy, found himself gradually approaching her. Sofia's Dance slowed as he began to match her steps. The gypsy quilter saw The magic between them as they danced that night.

Remembering Sofia's and Josef's new friendship and the ribbons Swirling and weaving around their heads, the gypsy quilter found herself Weaving fabric into the block she called...

#### Dancing Ribbons


Fabric #1-A Purple
Fabric #1-B Gold
Fabric #1-C Orange
Fabric #1-D Pink

OFabric #2 Backround


From each of these 4 fabrics, cut a 2 ½" x 6" rectangle and a 2 ½" x 10" Rectangle.

Cut a 2 ½" square
5 ½" square (4) 2 ½" x 7" rectangle

Starting with unit A, sew it to the one side of the center square, BUT, you are going to make an "incomplete Seam". Stop sewing about ½" before the end of the Square. Press seam away from square.



Now sew Unit B on to the above unit. You can sew A normal, complete seam. Continue with Unit D and then finally Unit C. Now you can go back to your "incomplete seam" and complete it!



E) Making sure it is centered, trim your block to 12 1/2".

\*As you sew this block, the edges will be uneven. Don't worry! It gets trimmed in the end.


- A) Sew 1 short rectangle from all of the #1 fabrics to each Of the backround triangles as indicated. (The rectangle Will be longer.)

  A) Sew 1 short rectangle from all of the #1 fabrics to each Of the backround triangles as indicated. (The rectangle Will be longer.)
- B) Sew the backround rectangles next to this strip-keeping The one edge even. (The new rectangle will be longer.)
- C) Now sew the longer #1 rectangles across the even Edge, keeping the corner square. (The new strip Will be longer.) NOTE!!! YOU MUST SEW PARTICULAR #1 STRIPS TO PARTICULAR TRIANGLE UNITS AS FOLLOWS:
  Sew the new purple strip to the unit with the orange rectangle. (Unit A)

Sew the new Gold strip to the unit with the purple rectangle. (unit B)

Sew the pink strip to the unit with the gold rectangle. (Unit D)

D) These 4 units are going to be sewn around a center Square (The 2 ½" backround square) using an "incomplete seam" technique. Lay all your pieces out as indicated:


## Wheelchair Quilt Pattern for Charity Donations


#### WHEELCHAIR QUILT


The wheelchair quilts that we make at Sunshine Linus are very simple and easy to make.

The quilts measure  $36" \times 36"$  with the bottom corners cut out to make way for the wheels of the wheelchair.




- ≈ Cut 16 x 9 ½" fabric squares
- ≈ Sew into four rows of four.
- Using a quilting ruler and rotary cutter, cut the two outside bottom squares diagonally.
- ≈ Quilt & Bind as desired.





#### An alternative pattern would be:

- ≈ Cut 144 x 3 ½" squares sewn into 12 rows of 12 squares.
- Cut diagonally through the bottom three squares on the two outside bottom squares.
- ≈ Quilt & Bind as desired.

## A QUILTER'S STORY with Sheri Passwater

In 2005, Sheri had a sleigh bed whose side rails came up to an odd height on her mattress, which made it extremely hard to find a bedspread that would fit her bed properly. Not one to be easily daunted, Sheri decided that if she couldn't find the perfect bedding, that she would just make it herself. After all, Eleanor Burns from the show Quilt in a Day could do it, so could she.

When Sheri told her late husband about her plans to make a quilt for their bed, he quickly replied, "You'll never get it done."

"Watch me!" she fired back.

Thus began Sheri's journey into the quilting world. Many half square triangles later, she completed her first quilt and she's never looked back since.

More quilts soon followed; quilts for her grandchildren, her daughter and son-in-law, as well as other family and friends. She even made charity quilts.

When Sheri moved to Florida from Iowa, she was able to find a quilting guild which helped her gain new skills and make wonderful friends. This year she decided to enter a foundation pieced, Rainbow Lone Star quilt in the South Florida Quilt Expo. It was her first time entering a piece in a quilt show!

#### **Quilting Q&A with Sheri**

#### What quilters inspire you?

Eleanor Burns was my first inspiration, but Angela Waters, The Midnight Quilter inspires me as well. I was lucky to be able to take several classes from her in Des Moines. I'm also very inspired by the women in my quilting guild. Monique and Nina are just some of the guild members who inspire me. They're so knowledgeable and talented.

## What are your favorite colors to use or your favorite style of quilting?

I love blues and yellows, but generally I work with colors and styles that appeal to the people that I'm making a quilt for, rather than what I would pick for myself.

#### What is your best quilting advice?

I have a couple of different things I would advise people.


First, even if you think that you're not gonna like something, give it a try. And even if you tried a technique and didn't like it, try it again. Ask another quilter how they would do that technique, what they would try instead, how they would arrange it, etc. We all work differently and have different ways of doing things. Keep trying until you figure out what works for you.

Second, join a quilting guild! But don't just join, get involved! Take workshops, volunteer, make friends and form relationships.

I'm doing things that I wouldn't have done 20 years ago. Don't let yourself stagnate, try new styles and techniques. You might find something that you love doing. You never know what you might like and getting involved in a guild is a great way to keep yourself inspired and learning.

#### What are you currently working on?

I'm currently working on a paper piecing pattern that I picked up from one of the guild recycling tables. I decided to make a quilt for a relative, and they picked this specific pattern out and chose these desert colors. (See picture of some of the blocks on the left.)

# A Heartfelt Farewell to the South Florida Quilt Expo...

This is a repost of a letter that was sent out on April 1st to the South Florida Quilting Community by The South Florida Quilt Expo.



## SOUTH FLORIDA QUILTEXPO

Dear Quilters, Vendors and Attendees, Today may be April Fools' Day, but this news is very real.

After more than 36 years and 18 shows the South Florida Quilt Expo (formerly Broward Quilt Expo), have come to the difficult decision that 2025 was our final show.

What began with just 4 guilds in Broward County grew into a vibrant collaboration of 9 guilds across 3 counties. However, after much deliberation, the Board has determined that we are unable to continue.

The rising costs of producing the show in 2027, combined with a decline in attendance and fewer volunteers available to manage the many committees, and less vendors willing to travel so far south in our state, have made it unfeasible to move forward.

We want to extend our deepest gratitude to everyone who has been a part of this

journey. To our vendors—both new and longtime supporters—thank you for believing in us. To our dedicated committee chairs who worked tirelessly behind the scenes, we couldn't have done it without you. And to the guilds, quilters, and attendees who have made this event so special, we are forever grateful.

While our show has come to an end, our online presence will remain active. We will continue sharing the 2025 award winners on social media, and our website will stay up through the end of the year, as we archive past photos and showbooks for the quilting community to enjoy.

But don't despair! Quilting is alive and well, and we know that many small guilds continue to host local shows. Perhaps one of the participating guilds will create a new event that grows into something just as wonderful as the Broward Quilt Expo once did.

Thank you for 36 incredible years of quilting, creativity, and community.

### Quip General Meeting Minutes ~ March 13, 2025

President Kay Walker called the meeting to order at 9:48 am. Daisy made a motion to approve the minutes, and Cathy Dance seconded the motion. Minutes were approved.

**Financial Report:** Checking balance: \$9885.82, Savings balance was \$5107.27. Income this month included \$50 for the sewing machine, \$60 for the doll workshop, \$1525 for the retreat, and \$36.00 for the recycle table. Total income was \$1671. Expenses were \$35.00 for QuickBooks, and \$61.25 for SunBiz to keep our non-profit status. Total expenses were \$96.25

**Charity:** Barbara We are looking for additional charities to donate to, and project suggestions. We have several quilt kits that need batting. We could use some volunteers to make quilt kits. There are a bunch of pillowcase kits.

Membership: Jan Ross joined the guild, and Rose Johnson was a visitor.

**Workshops and Retreats:** The next retreat will be on April 4-7. 23 people will be attending. April will be the forming of Round Robin/row by row groups. Charlotte will be teaching her purple cow quilt in May in conjunction with West Broward. Daisy will teach how to make wreaths in June, also in conjunction with West Broward. There will be a coloring workshop in the future. Workshops will be \$15 each, and payment is needed before you get the supply lists.

**Programs:** We will start our Round Robin/Row by Row in April and are planning on a celebration quilt challenge later this year.

**SFQE:** There may not be another quilt expo in two years. Some vendors have pulled out for the next one, costs are rising, and it is a lot of work.

BOM: We had 8 blocks this month.

**Old Business:** Karen Donovan won the raffle quilt. QUIP needs volunteers for both the secretary and treasurer positions.

**Raffles:** Iris won the BOM for this month. 50/50 collected \$48.00, \$24 to the guild, and \$24 to the winner, Kay Walker
