The American Quilters Society (AQS) quilt show was held in Daytona, FL, last week. I had the opportunity to attend with my two sisters and my daughter. While the show was small, the competition quilts were inspirational and the vendors were friendly and helpful. I had found a quilt pattern by Tilda in one of my quilt magazines and really wanted to make it. Her website is www.tildasworld.com. You can download her patterns for free. I printed out the pattern and took it to the show with me hoping to find some fabrics that would work. Lo and behold, the second booth in the show was Old South Fabrics from Cleveland, TN.

The website is www.oldsouthfabrics.com. To my great surprise, the quilt I wanted to make was on full display in the booth. The vendor had been to the Houston Market and visited the Tilda booth. Many of Tilda's quilts made by her were on display and were being raffled off to shop owners. The woman who owned old south fabrics won the quilt. And it is more beautiful in person. I walked up to the quilt to get a better look and was muttering to myself about how I would never be able to make it. The owner, Wanda Coley, approached me and explained that it was easier than it looked. Forty-five minutes later we were still talking about Tilda's patterns and her beautiful fabrics. Wanda had many of the fabric collections in her booth and she explained the

logic that Tilda used in designing her fabrics and patterns. My point to this story is that everyone I encountered at the show was as friendly and kind as Wanda was. Grumpy, mad, and angry people don't show up at quilt shows.

As I was leaving, I saw a woman I knew from the guild. I spoke her name and when she turned around it was a complete stranger who looked like my friend. My daughter joined me and we stood and talked to this stranger for another thirty minutes. It was like we were long lost friends.

2025 March Block of the Month

The upcoming month's block will be shown and instructions will be handed out at each monthly meeting.

BOM #2 will be turned in at the March meeting. Each month's block will be made with patterned fabrics in black, white and a feature color. The month's feature color will be the color from the previos month's fat quarter swap. So March's BOM will be made with green (February's color) as the featured color.

Please see the attached sample of March's BOM and this month's block directions.



2025 Fat Quarter Colors

January - Red
February - Green
March - Yellow
April - Light blue
May - Purple
June - Turquoise
July - Orange
August - Light green
September - Pink
October - Gray
November - Burgundy

A frightening bear or a wily fox would set him to spinning a tale that would stop the sun-browned children in their play. Devilment forgotten, they would approach old Janos with eyes wide as he brought the carvings to life with his story of adventure, of when he was a young man and surprised the bear, or competed with the fox.

His magical memories and narrow escapes from danger were told and retold. The Gypsy Quilter, still young, remembered old Janos and his youthful days as she pieced her block...

The Storyteller

- Fabric #1 Green- Cut (2) 5 1/8" squares (1) 4 ½" square
- O Fabric #2 Purple- Cut (4) 4 ½" x 4 ¾" rectangles*

 *It's easy to mix up which side is longest on this rectangle!
- Fabric #3 Brown- Cut (2) 5 1/8" squares
- A) Pair up the large green squares with the brown squares, RST. Draw a line down the diagonal and sew 1/4" away down both sides of the line. Cut apart on line and press open. You should have 4 half-square triangles.



B) Arrange all your pieces in a 9-patch formation as indicated:




Note the direction These rectangles Are going!

Sew together and press.

Now you are going to cut this block into 4 equal quarters. It should measure 13" square at this point, so cut it at the 6 ½" mark (both ways).



D) Take the upper right and lower left quadrants and turn them around so that the little squares are on the outside corners. Now sew them together and press.



February Show and Tell



QUIP General Meeting Minutes ~ February 13, 2025

President Kay Walker called the meeting to order at 9:43 am. Marilyn made a motion to approve the minutes, and Opal seconded the motion. Minutes were approved

Financial Report: Checking balance: \$8311.07, Savings balance was \$5107.27. Revenue for the month was \$1315. Expenses were \$136.47.

Charity: We will do a challenge for children's quilts in the future. A holiday stocking project will start in July. Holiday quilts are great also. Barbara will put the pattern for wheelchair quilts in the newsletter.

Workshops and Retreats: The next retreat will be on April 4-7. Deposits were due this month and the remainder is due in March. More than 20 people are signed up. Lisa Imberman taught a class on making dolls.

Programs: February program was Nina demonstrating how to do borders and bindings. March program will be about our favorite tools. March is also QUIP's birthday month, and we will ask our members who won ribbons at SFQE to bring their quilts for show and tell. There will be a row-by-row challenge for groups of 6 starting in April.

SFQE: There will be 3 classes held at the expo. Beginner friendly quilting, foam fabric board pictures, and reverse applique. There is only one spot available in the reverse applique class. The foam board classes have more spaces available. Signup is on the SFQE website. Award ceremony tickets are \$12, and they can be purchased on the website. The next SFQE will be on March 15-16, 2027. All quilt related activities (collection, judging, hanging and award ceremony) will be in the week preceding the show.

There will be vendor hop drawings at the show. Visit every vendor and get a stamp from each vendor. Turn your vendor hop form in at the information booth and be entered to win prizes. You do not need to be present to win.

Volunteers are needed to fill many positions at the show. Please see Robyn Eck to sign up. Cathy Dance will distribute raffle tickets and collect the money for them. Marilyn Ehren is the chairperson for the QUIP booth at the show. Sandy Glazer volunteered to assist Marilyn. We still need a volunteer to coordinate the raffle ticket sales at the show.

Membership: We have 74 paid members. Karen Campion was a former member of QUIP and rejoined this month.

BOM: There were copies of the instructions for block 2 at the February meeting, and they will also be posted on the website.

New Business: Dues are due in March. Members will be sent an invoice via email to pay their dues through QuickBooks. Nominations for officers are Kay Walker, President, Paula Wilson, Vice-President.

We received 15 fat quarters for the fat quarter drawing. The 50/50 drawing received \$84, which was split between the guild and the winner, Kay Walker.
